Group Missions: Nashville Info

What is Group Missions: Nashville?

- Group Mission is a nationwide, Christian-based, mission trip organization that offers many different mission opportunities.
- We are participating in their Nashville "Week of Hope" offering.

How will we be getting there?

- We will be driving up in two 15 passenger vans from Enterprise.
- Each driver has had their driving record checked.

Where will we be staying?

- We will be staying at Dalewood United Methodist Church, 2300 Ridgecrest Dr, Nashville, TN 37216
- Boys and girls will be separated and assigned sleeping areas on opposite sides of the Church Campus.
- All participants will need sleeping bags and/or air mattresses
- Showers will be at the nearby YMCA, 2624 Gallatin Pike, Nashville, TN 37216. We will be bussed to them at the end of the workday.

Meals

- We will eat together as a group for all meals.
- Local churches and organizations graciously host and provide meals at a multiple of locations around town.
- The volunteer meal hosts will likely not be able to accommodate special dietary concerns or restrictions, You will need to work with Joseph to plan ahead and bring options on your own if this is necessary.

Who will we be with?

- While our group will stay together for most of the trip, there will be plenty of times where we will get to interact with other youth from all over the country. This will help build bonds within the Christian community that extend far beyond Christ Church.
- We will go to each worksite with two Group Missions counselors who are trained in the job at hand. They will teach us the skill and give us the tools needed to complete the task at hand.



What will we be doing? We will work with the Nashville branch of Group Missions to:

- Work with lower-income children through an organization that offers tutoring, summer camp, a basketball league, job skills training, and other recreational and cultural activities as a positive alternative to the streets.
- Assist refugees through a ministry that engages churches, other organizations, and individuals to assist immigrants and refugees in the region.
- Serve with a local summer school that works to increase literacy to keep kids off the streets and out of the prisons.
- Help teach rising Kindergarteners their basics like ABCs, colors, shapes and work with them on reading in a safe summer environment.
- Spend time with individuals involved in a program that offers structured activities to older adults with cognitive or physical limitations.
- Provide help to seniors that are unable to work on the inside and outside of their homes
- Package and deliver diapers to families through the Diaper Connection.

2017 Mission Trip Packing List – What to bring and what NOT to bring:

Because we are a church youth group we ask all youth to dress modestly. Clothes that might be offensive to others, advertise or promote drinking or drug usage are not allowed.

Please pack appropriately.

Personal Items

Snacks/packed breakfast for the ride up Air mattress, cot or twin size foam pad Sleeping bag or sheets Blanket and pillow Towels and washcloth Modest swimwear and shower shoes Toothbrush and toothpaste Soap and shampoo laundry/plastic bag for dirty clothing Long pants or jeans Modest shorts and work t-shirts Pajamas, socks, underwear Sturdy shoes Water Bottle Bible/journal and pen Jacket Sunglasses Hat, visor or bandana Work gloves Rain gear Snacks Flashlight books for reading at night sunscreen/bug spray frisbee/playing cards/football money for travel meals and free day* phones/music(allowed only during travel)

Optional: instruments, fun items for theme days: Mustache Monday, Tropical Tuesday, Wacky Wednesday, Christmas on Thursday.

*We will be stopping for 3 meals total on the way up an the way back as well as 1 meal in downtown Nashville. We will be walking through downtown Nashville so there will be some oppertunity to potentially shop.

*IMPORTANT: You will want to have clothes for both work AND relaxation. Pack clothes you don't mind getting messy to work in. You can get away with wearing your work clothes more than once. This will help you with packing space. Please bring a trash bag to transport dirty clothes home



DO NOT BRING

- Fireworks/lighters/weapons
- drugs/alcohol/tobacco products/vapes
- Pornography
- Skimpy, immodest clothing
- Expensive clothes or jewelry

If any of these items are found, the punishment will be immediate expulsion from the trip. Parents will be 100% responsible for the transport and pick up of expelled youth.

Worth Noting:

- The leaders will have all parent information and will contact you only in case of any concern. Youth will not be allowed to contact parents so please don't contact the leaders to check in.
- Daily updates and photos will be sent by Robin Quick.
- Cell phones will be the only way to call home, but are only to be used on the trip to and from. Leaders will collect the phones and lock them up for the entire week.
- Label everything.
- Each person is responsible for their own stuff.
- Please check the weather forecast for the week.
- Youth may want to bring their own work gloves. Tools are provided, but if youth have a tool belt or tools they want to bring with them they may.
- Please be sure that each youth saves money to buy food on the for the trip home. Hide money in a suitcase if necessary!
- Medicine parents of youth requiring medicine during the trip must provide this medicine
 in advance so it can be inventoried and added to the master spreadsheet. Epi-pens and
 inhalers must be listed but do not need to be turned in. No exceptions.
