Lord we pray for our local ministry partner, the East Cooper Faith Network and their literacy-focused initiative, I-Beam, which provides reading mentors for 2nd through 5th grade students in our community. While volunteer mentors are still not allowed to go into the schools, we pray that the program leaders and educators will have wisdom in designing creative ways to provide the students with support during this time. THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION
