



HIDE AND SHEEP: The children will all find a good hiding place and one child will be the "Shepherd" and will try to find the sheep. When a sheep is found, that sheep will join with the "Shepherd" in finding more sheep.



Some sheep handprint options



Start by cutting an 8 inch long piece of yarn. Slide the yarn piece between your middle fingers. Make sure you have it there when you wind the rest of the yarn. If you're using chunky yarn, wind the yarn around your fingers about 70 times. (If you're using regular thickness yarn, you'll want to wind it about 130 times.)



Slide the yarn piece between your middle fingers. Make sure you have it there when you wind the rest of the yarn. Carefully slide the yarn off your fingers.



Then pull the ends of that 8 inch long piece of yarn as tightly as you can. If it helps, you can press your finger on the knot to make sure it's held tight while you tie. Tie another knot (you should have a double knot now) to hold it all together.



Using a sharp pair of scissors, (this would be a great time to pull out your fabric scissors if you have any!) carefully cut the loops of yarn, working your way around the entire circle, until all the loops have been cut.

You'll end up with a very messy looking pom pom. Don't worry. It's supposed to look like this!

Again, using your sharp scissors, trim and shape the pom pom into a nice ball shape



Now decorate to make your sheep!
